Your guide to the digital TV switchover



What is the digital TV switchover?

TV across the UK and the rest of the world is going digital. The existing analogue TV signal will be switched off and replaced with a new, stronger digital TV signal.

Why is it happening?

Switchover is happening so that Freeview services (digital TV through an aerial) can be extended to people who can't currently get them.

How will I be affected?

How the digital TV switchover affects you will depend on what equipment you currently have, or what you are planning to get:

When do I switch?


The TV signal in the STV North region is provided by nine transmitter groups which are each made up of a main transmitter and its local relays.

Analogue channels are switched off in two stages with the second stage happening two weeks after the first. At switchover Freeview will become available to virtually everyone.



at channels and services will I get?

ital TV, you can enjoy the five traditional TV channels, plus lots more. Everyone who their digital TV through an aerial will receive up to 20 of the most popular Freeview as standard. In fact, most people will receive around 40 depending on where they live. able to receive radio channels and programme subtitles directly through your TV and uipment will also provide audio description for people with sight impairments.

ike a greater choice of channels, you should consider freesat or Freesat from Sky, ribe to a service like Sky TV, Virgin Media², BT Vision or Top Up TV¹.

Your questions answered

Do I need to get a new TV?

No, you don't need to get a new TV as almost any TV can be converted, even a bl white one. Most digital boxes connect to a TV using a SCART cable. If your TV doe a SCART socket, you will need to ask for a digital box with a built-in 'RF modulate

What should I look for if I decide to get new equipment?

Look for TV sets, digital boxes and digital TV recorders that carry the 'digital tick It means they are designed to continue working after the switchover.

Will my video or DVD recorder still work?

Yes, your video or DVD recorder will still play back and record, but most won't l to record one channel while you're watching another. The simplest way to do this a digital TV recorder such as Sky+, V+ or Freeview+. A digital TV recorder with a 'I will also convert your TV.

Will I need a new aerial?

Most existing rooftop aerials are able to receive digital TV services like Freeview, T or BT Vision. If you have good reception now, you are unlikely to need to replace your rooftop aerial. However, some set-top aerials are unsuitable for digital TV and ma to be replaced.

Will my radio be affected?

No. The digital switchover relates to TV only and not radio. However, preparation result in interruptions to radio and TV services.

What if I live in a rural or island community?

t is worth planning for switchover early as it may take longer to get your equipment or services installed. The best way for you to find out about your digital options is o visit the postcode checker[†] at **digitaluk.co.uk**

What if I live in a flat?

f you live in a flat, it is likely you receive your TV signal via a communal aerial system. If so, ou need to talk to the person who manages your property as they may need to upgrade or eplace your building's communal TV aerial so you can receive a signal in your home.

The Switchover Help Scheme is here to help eligible people make the swi on one TV set. If you are eligible, we'll tell you about all the options availabil install the equipment in your home. We'll also carry out an aerial check an if needed, where possible. Plus we'll show you how to re-tune your equipm sure you are happy with how it all works.

Am I eligible? We can help everyone who:

- Is aged 75 or over, or
- Has lived in a care home for six months or more, or
- · Gets (or could get) certain disability benefits, or
- Is registered blind or partially sighted.

We'll ask you to pay **£40** for the standard offer, or if you're eligible and on certain income-related benefits it's **free**. If you're eligible, we'll write to you with full details in plenty of time. However if you want more information now, visit **helpscheme.co.uk**
