Dornoch Air-Strip - Proposed landing 1st July,1975 1530 hours

A Sergeant O'Brien today telephoned from Belfast intimating that a V.I.P. wished to land at Dornoch Air-Strip at 1530 hours and depart at 1600 hours on 1st July,1973. Unfortunately the line was very bad and the conversation a little stilted. The Sergeant asked if there were any fire appliances that might be available in view of the V.I.P being involved. No name was given. It appears that the aircraft to be used would be a Beaver type weighing approximately 5,000lbs. Registration not given.

Dornoch Aix-Strip is licenced as an Ordinary Licensed airfield and accordingly fire appliances are only required under the licence for scheduled air flights. If the fire squad is to be available it will require to call out the Burgh Squad for this purpose when they are normally off-duty - the lat July being a Sunday. The Town Council would require to pay the sen double time for the time involved. Accordingly I would be obliged if you would look into this matter and let me know by telephone on Friday, 29th June, 1975 if you are prepared for this special facility. I should add that private aircraft land at their own risk on payment of a landing fee of 30p per 1,000lb aircraft landing weight. The pilot is to be a Sergeant O'Brien and he told me to write to your Regiment regarding payment of the account. It could well be that the person telephoning was not Sgt. O'Brien but only giving the name of the pilot. I do not know what connection you have with Belfast, but would like the matter clarified before the webkend.

Additional to our letter of last year and my telephone conversations of 25th instant, here are the detailed proposals of our request for launching facilities at Dornoch Air Strip.

The proposed dates for the visit are now 14th/18th April, 1975, inclusive.

It is proposed to operate a Beagle Terrier tug aircraft G-ARLO and, at the present, one glider. It may be that we can acquire the use of another glider for that week and I have intimated to the Civil Aviation Authority that our operation might involve two gliders.

The hours of operation would be from 0900 to 1800 as a maximum, but this would, of course, be limited by the weather.

All gliders and aircraft are fitted with R/T equipment capable of contact with R.A.F. Lossiemouth, the controlling authority for Tain Danger Area on 130-4 Mc/s, and all aspects of the operation would be in accordance with the advice of the Civil Aviation Authority.

At present, we operate from a hard-surfaced strip of similar dimensions at Aboyne, Aberdeenshire, and pay a fee of 20p per launch to Aboyne Estates, the owners of the site. It is anticipated that our visit would involve some ten launches per day, but we feel that an agreed payment for the five-day period would be a preferable form of remuneration. We would be completely independent, requiring no fuel, accommodation or services at the site, and for the basic use of the strip by one aircraft and one glider for five days we would be prepared to offer up to £35.00. Of course, if another glider became available, we would gladly adjust any agreed figure.

It has long been the ambition of this Gliding Club to give its members the opportunity to fly in the North of Scotland, and your site is ideally placed with respect to the excellent accommodation available around Dornoch at that time of year.

I hope that this letter provides a wider information background on which to base your decision, but please do not hesitate to contact me at the above address if any further details are required.
