SPECIFICATION for Repairing and Reconstruction of the following road - Road to Beach, At Golf Club House, Castle Close, Eaglefield Road, Roseberry Avenue, Sutherland Road, Ferry Road, St. Gilbert Street, Close off former, North Street, Road to Slaughter House, Meadows Road, Games Park Road, Church Street, Croc an Lobht for Dornoch Town Council.

The Council retain the right to delete one or more of the above roads, if it is found necessary.

The Contractor will provide all materials and perform all cartages and carriages necessary for the thorough completion of the whole works. All materials to be of the best quality of their respective kinds and all workmanship to be executed in a thoroughly workmanship-like manner to the entire satisfaction of the Dornoch Town Council and their Surveyor, and to be handed over in a complete state to the Employers by a date to be agreed upon. The Contractor will provide and manip: ulate all the necessary plant, viz. steam roller, tar boilers, horses, water carts, brushes, etc. coal and oil, and all necessary labour, skilled and unskilled, that may be required.

The schedule lodged by the contractor will be held to include all charges necessary for the thorough completion of the works, and no claims for extras will afterwards be entertained on the ground of misconception regarding specification of works to be executed. It must be properly rated, summed, attested, and extended, the contractor being held entirely responsible for any error that may occur in same. The whole works to be commenced immediately on acceptance of offer and to be pursued continuously to completion, the time limit for completion being mutually agreed upon by the Contractor and the Employers before his offer is officially accepted.

The work to be commenced at the one end of each section and to be extended in one continuous coating towards the other end, no carting over work which has been newly done will be permitted.

Sealed Offers "marked Tender - Roads" to be lodged with D. Mackay, Esq., Town Clerk, Dornoch, to arrive not later than Wednesday 11th March, 1953.

The lowest or any of the tenders may not be accepted.

Note: - Where local labour is available, the contractor must employ same. Where metal is to be applied, it will be carted and spread over the roadway by experienced workmen, carefully regulated to the proper thickness and convexity over the whole surface at an average depth of 3" with a cross fall of 1/3" inch to the foot, the whole metal being turned over in the process of spreading. It shall be rolled with a steam roller not exceeding 10 tons in weight.

Where bituminous tar is to be applied, it shall be heated to from 220 to 240 degrees Farenheight in a boiler of approved make and applied at the rate of 1 gallon to 4 square yards.

The chips /

The chips to be used must be clean and cubical and prepared from good stone of suitable quality, broken to 132" gauge, and to pass through a 2" screen free from dust and all other material of less size than 2". The whole area to be rolled until a smooth and even surface is obtained. No tar shall be applied while the road is wet or damp. Any soft part to be properly boxed with hard and sound stones of suitable size, and all ridges to be properly levelled off. All ruts, depressions, or pot holes in the existing carriageway to be made up with metal and rolled before the surfacing coat is applied, and the entire area to be swept clean and free from dust before any metalling is done. Thereafter, when the tar is still hot, the chips specified to be spread at the rate of 80 square yards to the cubic yard. All defective kerbing will be repaired or renewed if necessary and to be properly relaid. All patching work must be carried out before the road is sprayed. A note of all materials delivered for the work to be forwarded to the Surveyor immediately they arrive.

The contractor will, by tendering, be held to have fully satisfied himself as to the nature and extent of the works to be performed, and shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Town Council against all actions, costs, suits, claims, demands and expenses arising out of or in connection with the carrying out of the works. He shall not sublet or enter into any subcontract for the carrying out of the works, or any part of them, without the consent in writing of the Burgh Surveyor. It must be noted that the road shall be swept clean and bare with wire brushes hard and soft from all mud and dust before surfacing is commenced.

Contractor to observe the provisions of Fair Wages Clause, and to keep proper wages and time books showing the wages paid and the hours worked by the people in his employ in or about the execution of his contract. Such wages books and time sheets to be produced on demand for inspection by the authorised officer of the Town Council.

On the Surveyor, whose decision in such matters will be final, condemnating any material or work as not being of proper quality, the contractor shall immediately remove such material from the site or break up such work as the case may be, and the contractor shall not be responsible for any payment in respect of same, but shall replace and make good such materials or works with proper materials and workmenship.

Should the work or conduct of the contractor be found unsatisfactory in any way, the Council may expel the contractor from the site and may themselves complete the works and may use the plant and materials upon the site for the completion of the works, or they may employ other contractors to complete the works. If the cost of the completion together with the sum which may have already been paid to the contractor, total more than the contract price, the balance will be a debt due by the contractor to the Council.

The work shall be commenced within seven days of the date on which the contractor is notified that his offer has been accepted, and to be entirely completed by the date to be agreed upon. A penalty of twenty shillings per day for every day beyond the date agreed upon for delay of completion during which the works remain unfinished.

The works may be extended or diminished without affecting the validity of the contract.

The contractor to allow 3% Engineering Fee on all items in the following schedules, to be paid on receiving first instalment.
