Jan: 3rd 1889

At a public meeting held within the F.C. School House, called for the purpose of considering the report of Sub Committee regarding the building of a house for Local Doctor.

The meeting unanimously resolved,

"That this meeting having heard, read recommendation of special committee, appointed at Public Meeting held on 7th Nov: 1888. to consider the best mode of investing monies collected with a view to the permanent advantage of the Resident Medical Officer's income, along with the decision of the General Committee to submit the whole to a public meeting of the subscribers, approve of the action of the Committee adopt their recommendation, and resolve,

1st. That the various sums collected by different parties, for the object referred to, be invested in

a house, whether bought or built, which shall cost £300 or thereby.

2nd That the following be appointed an acting committee to arrange for a suitable site, the preparing and completing of plans, and the receiving of offers for the erection of a new house or if deemed preferable, for the purchase of a house already built, with as little delay as shall consist with the interests of the object contemplated.

3rd That in the event of the committee being divided on the matter of expense, or suitability of site or plan, they be instructed to refer their difficulty to another public meeting of subscribers.
