Transfer of Road Functions to the Secretary of State

1. I am directed by the Secretary of State to enclose for the information of your Council a copy of the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955, (S.I.1955/1955) which comes into force on 1st April, 1956.
2. Article 2 and Part I of the First Schedule to the Order transfer to the Secretary of State the powers of the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation relating to the construction, maintenance and management of roads in Scotland, including the restriction and regulation of traffic. Article 3 and Part II of the First Schedule transfer to the two Ministers acting jointly certain powers which deal with matters which must be ordered uniformly throughout Great Britain, but which will be administered in Scotland by the Secretary of State. These powers relate to the general prescription of traffic signs and the variation of the general 30 m.p.h. speed limit. The other provisions of the Order deal with consequential matters. The Order does not transfer to the Secretary of State the powers of the Minister relating to the construction and use of vehicles, public service and goods vehicles, vehicle taxation and driving licences and tests. These matters will continue to be administered by the Minister on a Great Britain basis.

3. After the transfer becomes effective on the 1st April, the responsibilities of the Secretary of State will be discharged through the Scottish Home Department. The highways engineering staff of the Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation in Scotland will be seconded to the Scottish Home Department; the present Divisional Road Engineer will become the Chief Road Engineer for Scotland, and his staff has been augmented to deal with work in connection with bridges now discharged by the Ministry's Highways Engineering Division. Concurrently, the Ministry's Area Finance Officer and his staff will be transferred to the Scottish Home Department. The work at present carried out by these officers in connection with the examination of claims relating to the cost of collection of driving and vehicle licences will be undertaken by the Department as the agent of the Ministry.

4. Correspondence on matters covered by the Order should be addressed to the Secretary, Scottish Home Department, Bankhead Avenue, Sighthill, Edinburgh, 11, and on technical matters to the Chief Road Engineer at the same address.

5. For the time being circulars and instructions issued by the Ministry or the Divisional Road Engineer will, unless contrary intimation is given, remain in force; they will be replaced, as convenient, by circulars and instructions from this Department.

6. Copies of this circular and of the Order are enclosed for the Chief Financial Officer, the Surveyor and the Auditor.

**The Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order,
1955**

Made - - - - 22nd December, 1955

Laid before Parliament 30th December, 1955

Coming into Operation 1st April, 1956

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of December, 1955

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Ministers of the Crown (Transfer of Functions) Act, 1946(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Citation, interpretation and commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order, 1955.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), applies for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say—

“instrument” (without prejudice to the generality of that expression) includes in particular an Order in Council, order, rule, regulation, byelaw, judgment, decree, award, contract, certificate, licence or other document, and “made” in relation to an instrument shall be construed accordingly;

“the Minister” means the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation.

(4) Any reference in this Order to an enactment or instrument shall be construed as a reference thereto as amended by or under any other enactment or instrument.

(5) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1956.

Transfer of functions as respects roads in Scotland to Secretary of State

2. The functions of the Minister under the enactments described in Part I of the First Schedule to this Order (which enactments relate to the construction, maintenance and management of roads, bridges and ferries) are hereby transferred to the Secretary of State in so far as conferred by those enactments in their application to Scotland.

Transfer of certain functions to Secretary of State and Minister acting jointly

3. The functions of the Minister under the enactments described in Part II of the First Schedule to this Order (which enactments confer certain powers for the regulation of the use of roads and of traffic thereon) are hereby transferred to the Secretary of State and the Minister acting jointly.

Transfer of functions under local enactments

4. Any function of the Minister under any local enactment having effect in Scotland, being a function substantially similar to any function conferred on him by any enactment included in Part I of the First Schedule to this Order, is hereby transferred to the Secretary of State.

Transfer of property, etc.

5. With the functions transferred under the foregoing provisions of this Order there are also hereby transferred all property, rights and liabilities held or enjoyed by, or incumbent on, the Minister in connection with those functions respectively.

Supplementary and consequential provisions.

6.—(1) Any enactment or instrument shall have effect, so far as may be necessary for or in consequence of the transfers effected by this Order, as if references to, or which are to be construed as references to, the Minister were references to the Secretary of State or to the Secretary of State and the Minister acting jointly, as the case may require.

(2) The enactments and the instrument specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order shall in their application to Scotland have effect subject to the amendments specified in the second column thereof, being amendments consequential on the transfers effected by this Order.

(3) Where an instrument made under any enactment described in Part II of the First Schedule to this Order and in force at the time of the coming into operation of this Order empowers the Minister to give any direction, authority, approval, instruction or dispensation with respect to the form or character or the erection or siting of any individual traffic sign or to dispense with, add to or modify the requirements of the instrument in any particular case, the powers so conferred shall in Scotland be exercised by the Secretary of State.

(4) This Order shall not affect the validity of anything done in the exercise of powers transferred by this Order by or in relation to the Minister before the coming into operation of this Order; and anything which, at the time of the coming into operation of this Order, is in process of being done by or in relation to the Minister as aforesaid (including in particular any legal proceedings then pending to which the Minister is a party) may be continued by or in relation to the Secretary of State or the Secretary of State and the Minister acting jointly, as the case may require.

(5) Any approval, authority or licence given or other thing done by the Minister in the exercise of powers transferred by this Order shall, if in force at the time of the coming into operation of this Order, continue in force as if given or done by the Secretary of State or by the Secretary of State and the Minister acting jointly, as the case may require.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

Under this Order the powers of the Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation, which relate to the construction, maintenance and management of roads, bridges and ferries in Scotland, and which are set out in Part I of the First Schedule, are transferred to the Secretary of State. Provision is also made for certain powers, which relate to the use of roads, e.g., the prescription of the size, colour and type of traffic signs, to be exercised jointly by the Secretary of State and the Minister. These powers are set out in Part II of the First Schedule.

The Second Schedule makes certain consequential amendments.
