OPENING CEREMONY BY LORD KENNEDY

TUESDAY was a red letter day in the educational history of Dornoch and district The large new school was on that day opened. The pupils assembled at the old building, and marched in procession with their teachers to In front of the school the children, the new. teachers, School Board and other public bodies were photographed. This completed, the Chairman asked the architect to present Lord Kennedy, with a key with which he could open the door. The architect having done so, and Lord Kennedy having turned the key and having thrown open wide the doors, declared the school open for the free admission of all. A very large number of parish ratepayers and others turned out. The large centre hall which was seated for

The proceedings opened with the singing of Psalm 100. The Chairman delivered a eloquent address in which he reviewed the educational question and narrated the steps which has been taken by the Board up to the finishing of the building.
