The Sub Committee reported that they
accepted of an offer of £10 from Mr Donald
MacLean, Mason, for the making of Roads
etc at New School as marked off by the
Board.

Submitted letter from Lord Kennedy
concerning to perform the ceremony in
connection with the opening of the New School
on 7th January next.

Submitted Reports by the School Medical
Inspector on all the Board's School and which
were considered satisfactory.

The Board considered the matter of
staffing for the New Burgh School and after
being satisfied of the necessity of the
appointment of an additional assistant
resolved to appoint Miss Harriet S. Munro,
Infant mistress, Embo School, to the post
and -

and the Board make it a condition of Miss Munro's accepting the appointment that she undertake to attend classes and qualify to teach Cookery and Laundry Work, forthwith, if the Board find it necessary.

The Chairman, Mr. Mcintosh and Mr. Kennedy were appointed a Committee to meet Miss McAllan, Bang School, with a view to her undertaking the Cookery & Laundry classes meantime.

It was agreed to advertise for a Female Qualified Teacher for Imbo School a salary at the rate of £65 per annum. It was also agreed by the Board that, considering the applications for the above appointment to regard residence at Imbo an essential condition of the appointment.

It was directed that the Clerk write to the Department and claim the £10 grant in respect of the Peace of Gaile School.

It was agreed to procure Estimates from Mr. Bell, Draper, Mr. Munro, Joiner and Mr. Baillie, Draper for the Board for supplies.

Submitted List of Furnishing required for New School consisting of six Tables and two Cupboards for Class Rooms and 3 dozen Chairs. It was remitted to the Chairman & Messrs. Mcintosh & Kennedy to procure Estimates for same and with powers.

The Board had under consideration the matter of the Cleaning of the New School & Outhouses and resolved to allow Mr. Houston the sum of £20 per annum for his services.

agreed to inform Mr. Houston that the condition of the appointment by him of the person to clean the Buildings will be subject to one month's notice of removal on either side.

The Holidays in all the Schools are fixed as follows:- Christmas Day 25th inst and the New Year Week re-opening on Tuesday 7th January.

The Board had under discussion the arrangements for the opening of New School. Agreed that the hour of opening ceremony be 11 o'clock a.m. Resolved to meet again on 16 instant to further consider arrangements, and make appointment to Staff at New School. It was agreed to ask Mr. Phinister to attend.

one lot or in two separate lots viz:- 1. The
old Science Room Property and 2. The remainder
of the Property, and with immediate entry to both
lots. Offers to be lodged with Clerk on or before
22nd February current. It was remitted to the
Chairman, Mr Hardie, and the Clerk to draw
up the advertisement. It was agreed to insert
the advertisement in each of the following News-
papers viz:- Scotsman and Northern Chronicle in
one issue each and Northern Times two issues.
It was also agreed to issue a Handbill.
