Each patient received gifts at the New Year and at Easter. On order now are seven bowls of bulbs for the Wards. Outings are very special. The last for this year took place on 23rd October in John Gordon's bus - a beautiful afternoon - to Rosehall and round to Invershin Hotel for tea. On this occasion we invited four patients from Migdale Hospital to join us. Tommie Ross our driver was very helpful and kind to the patients, helping them in and out of the bus. The Trolley Service continues every fortnight, organised by Joan Charlton. She is looking for helpers.
