

100 YEARS AGO (July 16th, 1914)

MRS Pankhurst was again released from Holloway Jail on Saturday after having been on hunger and thirst strike since her re-arrest on Wednesday last.

Annie Wheeler, who on May 23 was sentenced to two months' imprisonment for wilful damage at the British Museum, was on Saturday released from Holloway Prison under the provisions of the "Cat and Mouse" Act.

Since her imprisonment, the prisoner has been forcibly fed and now has only a few days of her sentence to complete.

Carnegie to the children on their estate was held in Skibo Castle grounds on Friday in perfect summer weather.

He spoke of the delight it gave Mrs Carnegie, Miss Carnegie and himself to see once more the cheery faces of the little ones, who he hoped, would always carry in their memories their early visits to the Skibo sports.

Dr Hew Morrison having sketched the day's proceedings, the pipe-band played the long procession from the castle to the sports' park.

From the top of the castle waved the Combination Flag - Union Jack and Stars and Stripes - presented to Mr Carnegie many years ago by the tenantry.

The games were entered into with enthusiasm, Mr Carnegie himself acting as a starter, in which capacity he never fails to exhibit a tendency to favour the smaller and younger competitors in the events.

A feature of the programme was a Punch-and-Judy entertainment, which greatly delighted the younger members present.

The Inverness Town Band was also in attendance and their selections throughout the programme were greatly appreciated.

At the close Mr Carnegie went forward to the bandstand and offered them his congratulations on the high efficiency displayed.

At 4.30 tea was served to 1400 people in the marquee and souvenirs of the occasion in the shape of boxes of "Carnegie Rock" were presented to all.
