

SUTHERLAND FLORAL ART CLUB

25th AAAIVERSARY

The Inaugural Meeting of Sutherland Floral Art Club was held in the Royal Marine Hotel, Brora on 6th March, 1969. Nine people attended and from them the first Chairman, Mrs. M.Dudgeon , Crakaig, was elected with Mrs.B.Partington Secretary and Mrs.E.Traill as Treasurer. The first Minute Book cost 4/11 (about Annual Subscription 30/- (£1.50) and 4/visitors were to pay (20p). In October, 1969, the Countess of Sutherland agreed to become our President. From this small beginning the Club has slowly but surely developed until now we are holding our 25th Anniversary Dinner. Meetings have been held at a variety of venues between Dornoch and Helmsdale, but mainly in Golspie and Brora. Meetings of the Management Committee were initially held in various hotels but then in Committee Members' homes, as is still the case today. The Meetings of the Club have, over the years the benefit

Members and guests - demonstrations, tutorials, slide shows, film shows, Question Times, etc but the Club has also been involved in providing Floral Art for a wide range of causes -Dunrobin Castle, Bonar Bridge Salmon Queen Week, Young Farmers' Dinners, Dornoch Street Fayre, the Highland Show at Ingliston, Ring of Fair Flowers in shops in East Sutherland, weddings, funerals, opening of the Dornoch Firth Bridge, a variety of churches, not least Dornoch Cathedral in 1969, 1977 and 1989, to mention a few; we had hardly drawn breath when we were invited to participate in the Sutherland Agricultural Show. This has always been a very large project, with a different theme each year, and one that has continued for twenty five years! It is now the greatest fund raiser for the Club, not because of the generosity of the Show Committee covering our expenses; it has not been without its hiccups, with lack of space

being a recurrent theme, and an episode of vandalism in 1985 on the night before the Show when irreparable damage damage was done. Needless to say, every time the Show Committee came up with the answer.

As to the Club itself it has had its high points and its low points. Golspie Golf Club was regarded as ideal but could not accommodate us between April and September, our main season; eventually we settled in the Sutherland Arms Hotel for a number of years until moving to the Stag's Head Hotel fairly recently. At first we were

complete beginners mostly and tutorials were frequent in the early days. These were abandoned in 1976 due to poor support but revived again in 1978 by popular request, still continuing from time to time. Not all projects were a success - a library for Members opened in 1972 was closed in 1973 with the proceeds just 60p. A Christmas Fayre held at different times in Golspie and Rogart was held for a year or so but abandoned due to poor attendances in poor weather, although takings were quite good.
