

NOTICE TO INTENDING COMPETITORS

1. The decision of the Judges appointed by the committee to be Final.
2. Protests must be handed to the Secretary, in writing, within an hour of the Event, with a deposit of half the Prize Money at Stake, which deposit may be forfeited should the Committee consider the protest to be unwarranted.
3. No Prize will be awarded unless Three Competitors compete; No Third Prize unless Four compete. No Fourth Prize unless Five compete.
4. Prize Winners of Events No. 7 and 8 may enter for the Open Dancing Section.
5. Competitors must appear in proper costume. In Events Nos. 1 to 8, 27 to 33, 36 to 38 Highland Dress is imperative, and in Events Nos. 54 to 59 the kilt must be worn.
6. Pipers must bring a list of Three Piobaireachds, Three Strathspeys, Three Reels, and Three Marches for the Judges to select from, and will play as drawn by Ballot. The Prize Pipers will play to Dancing if required.
7. Three Tries will be allowed in Nos. 13, 18, 21 to 26, 46, 50, 51 and 53; 54 to 59.
8. All Competitors must be ready when called. Any Competitor misconducting himself will not be allowed to compete, and if previously successful, will forfeit his Prizes.
9. Competitors must leave the ring after each Competition.
10. The Prize Money will be paid to Competitors as soon as the result of each Event is verified.
11. Entries on the day of the Games can only be received at the Secretary's Hut. All Competitors must pay for Admission to the Field.

A Medal presented by Mrs Carnegie Miller, Skibo, will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in the Open Piping Events. In the event of a tie the winner of the Piobaireachd which is the senior competition will be accepted as the overall winner.

A Medal presented by the Hon. Lord Migdale, Ospisdale, will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in the Open Light Events excluding Events 47, 48, 49, 52 and 53.

The County of Sutherland Junior Piping Trophy, presented by the late Major Ian M. Campbell, C.B.E., of Balblair, will be awarded to the Winner of Event No. 1, who will hold the Trophy for One Year.

The Balblair Challenge Cup will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in the Piping Events (Nos. 2 and 3).

The Macpherson Challenge Quaich, presented by Hugh Macpherson, Esq., Edinburgh, will be awarded to the Boy with the Greatest Number of Points in Events 2 and 3.

A special Money Prize will be awarded to the Competitor setting up a New Record in any of the Open Hammer and Ball Events.

The Gardner Cup, presented by Alistair Gardner, Esq., Inverness, will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in Events Nos. 31, 32 and 33.

The Grant Cup presented by the late Captain Robert Grant, Fynbar, Dornoch, will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in Events 7 and 8.

The William Cairn Sutherland Memorial Shield presented by Mrs F. E. Sutherland, Burnfoot, Brora, will be awarded to the Competitor with the Greatest Number of Points in Events 28 and 29.
