MODERATOR'S DIARY

11 November: In the morning, the Moderator will lay a wreath on behalf of the General Assembly, at the Annual Service of Remembrance in Edinburgh City Chambers, before leading the prayers of intercession at the Remembrance Sunday Service in St Giles' Cathedral, and then attending the Armistice Day Service at the Scottish National War Memorial.

In the afternoon, the Moderator will provide a Closing Prayer and Blessing at the National Centenary Service in Glasgow Cathedral, commemorating the First Armistice. The service will be attended by HRH The Princess Royal and will be broadcast live on BBC television.

12 November: The Moderator will host the third of a series of buffet lunches for Church of Scotland office staff.

In the evening, Mrs Brown will host a buffet Dinner and discussion focused on encouraging good mental health.

13 November: The Moderator will visit a place of Worship with the Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church and the Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese St Andrews and Edinburgh, to mark Scottish Interfaith Week.

In the evening, the Moderator will host a buffet Dinner during Christian Aid's new CEO, Amanda Mukwashi's visit to Scotland, to allow her to meet ecumenical leaders from Christian Aid's sponsoring churches.

14 November: The Moderator will host the fourth of a series of buffet lunches for Church of Scotland office staff.

In the evening, the Moderator will attend '<u>Untold Stories</u>: <u>Women of Faith in the Suffragette Movement</u>', a Scottish Interfaith Week event at the Scottish Storytelling Centre in Edinburgh.

15 November: The Moderator will chair '<u>Honest Conversations: Exploring Evangelism, Da wah and Dialogue</u>', an event being held at the Steeple Church in Dundee, during Scottish Interfaith Week.

16 November: The Moderator will attend the St Margaret's Chapel Guild: Lunch, Service and AGM at Edinburgh Castle. In partnership with Historic Scotland, St Margaret's Chapel Guild looks after the small Chapel within Edinburgh Castle (the oldest building in Edinburgh) which is dedicated to St Margaret, Queen of Scotland.

In the evening, the Moderator will attend the Boys' Brigade Annual World Mission Evening at Largs St John's, when Mrs Brown will be presented with a cheque for the Boys' Brigade World Mission Fund. The Fund seeks to develop wider knowledge of the World Mission Work of the Church of Scotland and international work of the Boys' Brigade. Over the years, Boys' Brigade Companies have raised over 1.5 million to support overseas projects.
