

25 YEARS AGO (July 28, 1978)

A proposal to lengthen Dornoch's airstrip on the Links by 300 metres to enable bigger aircraft to bring in parties of golfers from the south is shortly to go before the regional council for consideration.

A preliminary meeting has already been held between regional and district officials and the promoters of package tours for golfers – the Burnthills group of companies, who are the owners through Norscot Hotels of the Dornoch and the Royal Golf Hotels in Dornoch.

Revealing the proposal last week, Burnthills' chairman Mr Peter Ross said: "We are very keen to bring up parties of golfers to use the excellent facilities of the Royal Dornoch golf course and the other courses in Sutherland, and we have been investigating this very fully.

"But unfortunately the airstrip at Dornoch is not long enough to take in a load in the type of aircraft that we own. It would need to be extended by approximately 300 metres or marginally more or less."

John Mackay of Corry, Rogart, 90-year-old retired farmer, helped to roll 460 fleeces at nearby Morvich Farm recently.
