PROGRAMME OF PROCEEDINGS

AS THE PROCESSION IS DUE TO ARRIVE AT THE WEST DOOR OF THE CATHEDRAL AT 10.55. a.m. the Congregation are requested to be in their seats by 10.45.a.m.

At 10.30. a.m. a Procession will assemble outside the Courthouse in Castle Street, Dornoch. It will be led by two pipers followed by the Bannerman bearing the Official Banner of THE DINGWALL PURSUIVANT IN THE COURT OF THE LORD LYON, immediately after will follow The Dingwall Pursuivant followed by the Bannerman bearing the Banner of The Dornoch Area Community Council. This Banner will remain veiled until the Community Council has received The Grant of Arms.

Immediately following this Procession will be The halberdiers bearing the Lochaber Axes of the Royal Burgh of Dornoch who will lead the Procession of the Chairman of the Community who will walk with the Provost, each being followed by the Members of their respective Councils. It is hoped that the Provost, Bailies and Treasurer will be robed and that The Provost will wear his Chain of Office.

THE PROCESSION

The Procession will arrive at the West Door of the Cathedral at 10.55.a.m., the Pipers will take their places on either side of the path where they will be

joined by the Halberdiers who will form a Guard of Honour. When the Procession has entered the Nave, the Pipers and the Halberdiers will take the seats reserved for them in the back row of the Nave.

The Procession will continue down the Nave. Arriving at the Crossing, Dingwall will be seated and the Bannermen will place their Banners in the stand and be seated. The Chairman will lead his Procession to the North Transept where they will take the reserved seats. The Provost will lead his Procession to the South Transept where they will take the reserved seats.

IN THE CATHEDRAL

The Minister as Moderator will take his place at the Table in the Crossing, announce the Presentation of the Grant of Arms and the gift of a Chairman's Badge of Office to the Community Council and invite the Chairman, the Provost and Mrs. Holt to join him. He will then invite Dingwall to make the Presentation of the Grant of Arms. Dingwall, preceded by his Bannerman and followed by the Community Council Banner, will approach the table where he will be seated. His Bannermen will stand behind him, the Community Council veiled Banner to his left.

The Minister will invite the Provost to explain briefly the reason for the existence of the Community Council etc.

The Minister will thank the Provost and ask Dingwall to read out the Grant of Arms and then to present it to the Chairman. Dingwall will thereafter present the Ceremonial Banner to the Chairman, who will thank him.

The Minister will then ask Mrs. Derek Holt to invest the Chairman with the Badge of Office which Mr. and Mrs. Holt have gifted to the Community Council. The Chairman will return suitable thanks.



DORNOCH STREET PLAN



ROAD. Main A9 road gives access from south via Inverness (distance 60 miles by Struie A836). Visitors touring the west coast may either take the A835 from Ullapool to Elphin then A837 to Bonar Bridge to join A9 or go round the west and north coasts reaching Dornoch on the return journey by A9 from Caithness.

RAIL. Dornoch no longer lies on the railway from Inverness to the north. Dornoch's rail-head for those travelling from the south is at Bonar Bridge (Ardgay) about 13 miles from Dornoch. For those travelling from the north the rail-head is at Golspie about 12 miles away. In both cases there are connections with Dornoch by 'bus service operated by Highland Omnibuses Ltd. Time-table information should be procured from British Rail at Inverness.

OMNIBUS. Dornoch is a terminal for 'buses operated by Highland Omnibuses Ltd., Farraline Park, Inverness. Services are run from Inverness along the east coast to Caithness. Summer tours are also operated. Time-table information should be obtained from Highland Omnibuses Ltd., Farraline Park, Inverness. Services are operated by mail car from Lairg to Scourie, Lochinver, Kinlochbervie, Durness and Tongue by Sutherland Transport & Trading Co. Ltd., Lairg, Sutherland, Tel.: Lairg 65, from whom Time-table information should be obtained. There are no 'round the coast' services on the west or north. Mail cars are centred on Lairg which is on the Inverness to the north railway line.

AIRFIELD. There is a landing field on Dornoch Links suitable for use by light aircraft. The field is in regular use but advance warning of intention to land must be given to Town Clerk. Dornoch, TEL.: 205, at least twelve hours before estimated time of arrival.
