



Dr Andrew Thomas Crummy (MBE) is a renowned Scottish artist, who has designed several major community tapestry works including the Battle of Prestonpans Tapestry (2010), Scottish Diaspora Tapestry (2014), Great Tapestry of Scotland (2013), and the Spirit of The Highlands and Islands Tapestry (ongoing) amongst many others.



Born in Craigmillar, Edinburgh, Andrew Crummy's introduction to art was through the Craigmillar Festival Society and his childhood memories are full of Community Arts events that involved festivals, drama, music, clowns, colour and laughter.

We are pleased to welcome Andrew to Dornoch Fibre Fest where he will give the keynote talk reflecting on his work, as brought to life by the community of stitchers throughout Scotland.



Masterclass 2: Embroidery Panel

Skills needed: Knowledge of basic embroidery stitches

irstie Campbell is a Textile Artist, Designer and Educator who loves hand embroidery and the stories that can be told through stitch. Kirstie gained a First Class degree in Embroidery at Manchester School of Art, and has worked as a commercial wallpaper & textile designer and with The Embroiderer's Guild at Hampton Court Palace.

Most recently she has been the Stitch Coordinator for The Spirit of the Highlands & Islands Tapestry project, where she worked in collaboration with over 650 stitchers to bring the Spirit of the Highlands to life through stitch. Her passion is discovering and learning new stitches, re-discovering old ones and sharing this creativity with others through teaching, crafting and creating.



In this Masterclass you will work with a beautiful range of speciality yarn, linen, tweeds and fibres sourced from the Highlands & Islands, to craft a 'journeystone' which tells your story in stitch.

Using gorgeous materials and combining different stitches, hand embroidery, applique, needlefelting and cording you will learn how to transfer your own design from paper to fabric, learn new stitches and re-explore old ones.

All materials will be provided, but feel free to

bring along your own sewing kits. It might be helpful to bring a few visual ideas along with you – photographs, drawings or ideas about flora and fauna, fossil shapes, lichens, trees, history, landscape, places, myths, folklore.....



nne learned to weave at school, and plunged into the world of spinning in her 20's. Flocks of sheep, gardening, and a career teaching agriculture, horticulture, and countryside conservation are woven into her crafts. Natural dyeing is an obvious extension of her many interests, leading into a world of plant and lichen identification, where every walk speaks colour.

In this Masterclass you will use cochineal and learn the different techniques for fixing and altering dye.

Using a range of fibres, yarn and fabrics, previously mordanted with accepted chemicals, the afterbaths will explore the potential colour changes to be discovered.



The techniques learned will apply to most natural dyes, and the intention is for participants to have the skills, confidence and knowledge to explore the world of colour for themselves.



Participants will share a hotplate and will be expected to bring protective clothing and gloves.

All materials will be provided, and everyone will leave with notes on techniques, worksheets, and sources for dyes and mordants.

an Beadle is a designer and weaver of contemporary textiles for fashion, interiors and accessories. She has many years experience of teaching and this class is suitable for absolute beginners and those with a little experience.

In this Masterclass you will learn how to use a 4 shaft table loom to weave the classic Herringbone Tweed we all associate with Harris Tweed.



Twill patterns have many variations, but all are characterized by the diagonal lines formed in the weaving structure, with herringbone being the most recognizable.

This will suit absolute beginners but also weavers wanting to develop their skills further, as Jan will show you how to create new patterns within this structure taking the mystery out of pattern reading.

The four shaft looms will be set up ready to go, enabling you to explore texture and colour combinations on the day and go home with your own unique piece of tweed.

All materials to be used on the day are included.



Masterclass 5: Clasped Weft Weaving

Clasped weft is a brilliant technique to learn even if you only have a basic rigid heddle loom as it enables you to have two colours across the width of the loom.

In this workshop we will be able to combine twill patterns to create a unique landscape picture in weaving.

This will suit absolute beginners but also weavers wanting to develop their skills further, as Jan will show you how to manipulate the weft thread within the structure.

The looms will be already set up with the colours of the Highlands, the aim being that you will go home with your own unique woven landscape.

All materials to be used on the day are included.



Intermediate 4: Amigurumi Crochet

Skills needed: Knowledge of basic crochet stitches

avina Turner is a keen knitter and crocheter, who designs and produces Amigurumi crochet animals. She sells her patterns through her Ravelry page and made items through Barn Owl Bothy, Dornoch.

Crochet is a very adaptable method of producing fabric which can be worked flat or in the round. In this Masterclass you will learn how to work crochet in the round, to produce a Japanese form of 3D crochet known as Amigurumi, Davina's favoured form of crochet. The method can then be fashioned to create small stuffed creatures. In this workshop we will combine both flat and 3D methods to create a Bee Bookmark.



Davina has designed a new pattern for this class at Fibre Fest!

The workshop will suit those at Intermediate level with practical knowledge of the basic stitches.

Davina will guide you through the production of the various elements, demonstrating the magic circle technique, stitches used and colour changes. At the end of the workshop you will have completed your own little smiling bookmark.

All materials are included.

Masterclass 6: Sculptural Knitting

arol Janes is an experienced knitter and crafter who is passionate about encouraging beginners. As someone who has taught in the adult education sector, Carol is keen to encourage the development of new skills and help progress an individual's journey in knitting and crochet.

Carol has explored the use of lace knitting as a means of creating sculptural decoration for use outdoors since she visited Shetland Wool Week in 2012 and was inspired by Anne Eunson's knitted fence.

In this Masterclass you will learn to knit a traditional Shetland lace design called diamond trellis using giant needles and spun polyester twine.



A confident knitter should complete the three pattern repeats for the oblong wall hanging in 2-3 hours. You can then decide whether to continue in the second half of the session making your wall hanging larger, or explore knitted and crochet flowers to add to the wall hanging and complete the rest of the panel at home.

You will learn to follow a chart to produce a panel of lace knitting, learn suitable cast on and cast off methods, fibre options, the use of a safety thread in lace knitting, adding decorations to your outdoor knitting and working in 2 colours. In addition we will discuss how to display lace knitting outdoors, stretching, fixing, maintenance and choosing an appropriate location.


All materials to knit with are supplied, and materials to fix the panel can be purchased on the day.

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
Learning Techniques: Darning & Mending

Skills Required: Basic Stitching Skills



In today's world mending is 'ecological' and 'ethical', helping to reduce clothing consumption. But you can also embrace the enjoyment of stitching much loved and well worn items of clothing, giving them a 'second life' or repurposing clothing into a completely new item. In this class you will learn the stitches and methods to mend or darn, exploring the creative side to what was once considered a chore.

Please bring:

- 1. an item of clothing to be repaired, patches and/or a suitable fabric of similar weight and strength as the item needing repair.
- 2. a variety of needle sizes, thimble, scissors, pins and a fabric pencil/chalk
- 3. 100% cotton thread and/or embroidery thread or darning wool

Learning Techniques: Peg loom with recycled fabric

Jo Henderson is the Highland Community Waste Partnership

(HCWP) Project Officer for The Lairg and District Learning Centre. HCWP is led and driven by eight community groups across the Highlands, working to reduce waste in our communities by changing the way that we consume.

In previous generations clothing and linen was frequently recycled into useful articles for the house. In this class Jo will show you what a Peg Loom is and how you can recycle fabrics into a tough, attractive rug or sit mat. Jo will help you thread up your loom, prepare the recycled materials and show you how to weave correctly to ensure that the material is stable and finished properly.

All materials will be provided, but if you have any sheet, duvets or curtains you would like to use, please bring them along. The peg loom will be on loan for the duration of the class only.





Learning Techniques: Supported Spindle Spinning

Of Russian nationality, Olga Jamieson is now based in Drumnadrochit where she and her husband run Loch Ness Spindles. Olga is an experienced knitter and spinner from a family of spinners, and is well known for her beautiful fine spun lace shawls.



Olga will demonstrate how to process wool and flax by hand and which tools to use to achieve the best results. You will then learn how the spindle works, how to pull and twist a thread using a spindle and how to ply yarn. There will be a selection of several styles of spindle (supported or drop spindle) and you will chose a spindle suitable for you to spin, as well as a wide selection of materials (wool, silk, flax, etc.).

All materials will be included, with the exception of the spindles, which will be provided for the lesson only.
