

'Evacuees' launch events

A march of 'evacuees' was the opening event of a programme of commemorations to mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day in Dornoch last Thursday.

Members of the Young Curators Club at Dornoch museum Historylinks dressed up as World War II evacuees and gathered at Dornoch War Memorial along with others.

A lone piper played before leading a march from the memorial to Cathedral

Green. On the Green they were joined by members of other youth organisations.

A short open-air service was held by Rev Simon Scott, priest in charge at St Finnbar's Scottish Episcopal Church, Dornoch.

The bells of Dornoch Cathedral, St Finnbar's and Dornoch school rang out for five minutes for peace.

The International Tribute and the Act of Remembrance was read; a lamp of peace was lit; and a wreath laid.
