



TIME CATCHES UP WITH 'THE COFFEE POT'

A WELL-LOVED little railway engine, nicknamed "The Coffee Pot," which has chugged over the Highland Railway for about 50 years, is to be pensioned off.

"Such a nice wee engine," said the people of Dornoch, Sutherland, when they heard yesterday that, by British Railways edict, heavier locomotives and coaches are to be used on the seven-and-a-half-mile branch line to the Mound.

"The Coffee Pot" is a passenger tank engine with a tall smokestack and four large wheels. Only a few of this type are still running in Britain.
