## SECOND REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE

## FOR MANAGING THE MEIKLE FERRY FUND.

DORNOCH, 3d MARCH, 1810.

THE Committee beg leave to intimate to the Public, that they have come to the following resolutions regarding the final arrangement of this Fund.

1st. That (in addition to the sum of 509l. 15s. sterling already paid, as stated in their first Report,) a second dividend of One thousand pounds shall be paid on Thursday the 29th instant, agreeable to the following scheme.

2d. In order to make some provision for such of the objects of this Fund as may hereafter be reduced to indigence, it is resolved, that whatever balance may remain after paying the charge of printing, postage, and other expences, shall be paid to the Ministers and Kirk-Session of the Parishes to which the people drowned belonged, in proportion to the number of individuals lost by each Parish; and to be by them appropriated exclusively to the relief of such of the relatives of the sufferers by this accident as may require assistance from their Poors' Fund, for the first seven years succeeding the 1st day of June next, after which period, if any sum remain undisposed of, the same to be annexed to the common Poors' Fund of each Parish respectively.

3d. That as soon as the Committee can effect these arrangements, the Book containing their Minutes, the names of the persons drowned by the fatal accident at the Meikle Ferry, in the County of Sutherland, on the 16th August last, and the List of the Subscribers, by whose generous liberality about 176 destitute persons, consisting of widows, orphans, parents, or sisters of the sufferers, have received effectual relief, shall be delivered over to the Minister of Dornoch, to be lodged with the Records of the Session of that Parish, that the whole circumstances attending that dreadful event may be preserved, and handed down to posterity.

The Committee beg leave to offer their most grateful acknowledgments to the Nobility and Gentry who have so liberally contributed to this humane and interesting object, and request the Gentlemen who kindly undertook to receive subscriptions, and all who aided or patronised their efforts, to accept their best thanks.

## ABSTRACT.

It appears by the above Statement that 99 persons were drowned, of whom 43 were males, and 56 females—of the males 23, and females 16 were married people; 2 were widows; 20 unmarried young men, and 38 girls; 12 were saved by swimming or clinging to the boat, of whom 4 were males and 8 females.
