Unveiling of 1939-45 Panel

An Impressive Ceremony

The unveiling of the 1939-45 Panel on Dornoch War Memorial which contains the names of 32 members of the services who made the supreme sacrifice in the 1939-45 war, was performed by Brig. Gen. Paynter, Lord Lieutenant of the County of Sutherland.

Assembled at the memorial were the Provost, magistrates and councillors of the Burgh along with the town clerk, members of the War Memorial Committee, contingents of the local branch of the British Legion, Territorials, ex-Service men and women, ministers and church choirs. Included in the gathering were the Convener and the county clerk of Sutherland.

Prior to the unveiling ceremony a short religious service was held—conducted by Rev. J. G. Levack, B.D., and Rev. William Macleod, M.A., H.C.M.

On his arrival at the memorial the Lord-Lieutenant was received by the Provost (Mr J. G. Macdonald) who, in his introductory remarks said:—
"We are honoured in having with us to-night the Lord-Lieutenant of Sutherland and are deeply grateful to him for accepting the invitation of the War Memorial Committee to come and unveil this panel. Many of us present stand around this memorial for the second time, on this occasion to honour the memory

of those who made the supreme sacrifice in the 1939-45 war. This ceremony must, inevitably, re-open recently healed wounds, and, on behalf of the community, I would express deepest sympathy to all relatives and friends of the Fallen."

Names Read

Thereafter the Provost called on the hon. secretary of the War Memorial Committee—Mr William Skinner, town clerk—to read the Roll of the Fallen and the Lord-Lieutenant then addressed the gathering.

In his opening remarks General Paynter stated that he considered it a great privilege and honour to come to the capital of Sutherland and unveil the panel. He gave a most impressive address.

He concluded:—

"These men have made the supreme sacrifice and it is up to us to see

"What here is faithfully begun
Shall be completed, not undone."

"Let us all go away with this determination, to see how we can, in some practical way, not selfishly, to help this country of ours as opportunity may occur to us each, individually. If we don't take this warning, shall we get another chance, do we deserve another chance?"

The Lord-Lieutenant then unveiled the panel and one minute's silence was observed. Rev. J. G. Levack engaged in the Prayer of Dedication and after the rendering of some verses of Psalm 103—followed by the Benediction—Pipers K. Macrae and James Duff played the lament "Lochaber No More." The singing of a verse of the National Anthem concluded a most touching ceremony.

The Lord-Lieutenant afterwards shook hands with and spoke to, each ex-Service man and woman present, and also members of the Territorial contingent.

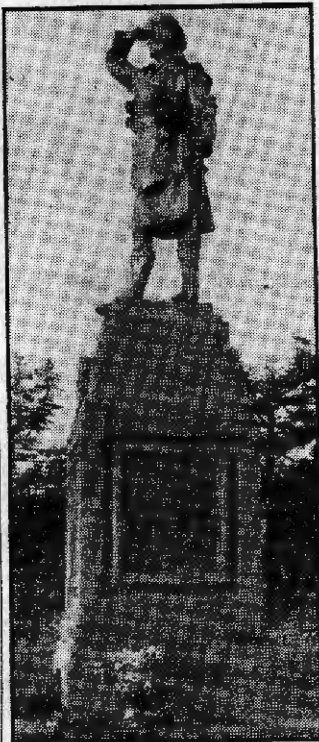

Dornoch Honours Its Fallen Heroes



THE 1939-45 panel on Dornoch War Memorial, on which are inscribed the names of thirty-two Servicemen who made the supreme sacrifice, was unveiled last night by Brig-General G. C. B. Paynter, Lord-Lieutenant of Sutherland.

Assembled at the memorial were the provost, magistrates, and councillors of the burgh, along with the town clerk, members of the war memorial committee, contingents of the local branch of the British Legion, Territorials, ex-Service-men and women, and members of the local clergy and church choirs.

Included in the gathering were the convener and county clerk of Sutherland.

Religious Service

Prior to the unveiling ceremony a short religious service was conducted by the Rev. J. G. Levack, and the Rev. William Macleod, honorary chaplain to the Forces.

The Lord-Lieutenant was received by Provost J. G. Macdonald.

The Lord-Lieutenant gave a most impressive address, and said: "Let us all go away with determination to see how we can, in some practical way, not selfishly, help this country of ours as opportunity may occur to us each individually."

"If we don't take this warning shall we get another chance? Do we deserve another chance?"

He then unveiled the panel, and one minute's silence was observed.

The object of this Competition is to, (a) encourage boys and girls to indulge in a popular sport, viz: golf (b) to promote team spirit and personal endeavour and (c) to induce youngsters to get to know the Legion better.

2. ELIGIBILITY

As previously, Branches will be required to act as sponsors, and take an active part in promoting and running the competition. The Trophy will be awarded to the Branch Sponsored Golf Team which wins the competition, but will be retained by the sponsoring Branch.

3. COMPETITION RULES

- (i) A Branch wishing to enter for the Competition will please complete the attached form and send it to the National Welfare Officer, who will forward the official entry form.
- (ii) Each Branch is required to make all the necessary arrangements with the Golf Course for holding the Competition, including the drawing up of competitor lists, preparing the draw, checking that handicaps are properly certified, issuing the score cards and collecting them at the end of the Competition.
- (iii) The competition will be in two parts, the individual events and the team event. The first will comprise of stroke play in respect of two age groups of either sex, Section "A" up to 12 years and Section "B" 13 - 16 years, the best score in each of these two age groups will form the first part of the entry for the Competition. The second part will be the team event which will be a three ball three-some in which the winning team's two best scores will go forward to complete the Branch entry for the competition. Competitors in Section "A" and Section "B" are eligible to compete in the three ball three-some but any such competitors whose names and scores go forward as the Branch entry for two parts must have actually played in both parts and submit cards accordingly. Failure to compete in any one part of the competition will lead to disqualification. Completed application forms must have attached the four score cards.

If there is one thing certain in life it is that there is nothing certain in life.

You may remember that I wrote to you earlier this year concerning the possibility of floodlighting the War Memorial. One of the attractive aspects of the project was that there would be no financial obligation on the Branch either for the installation of the lighting or the day to day running and maintenance. The majority of the members found the matter to be favourable.

All has now changed!

It appears that money is short and the original support which was expected from CASE will not now be forthcoming unless any of the projects to which CASE is committed falls through. Further correspondence is expected from CASE but not until December.

The cost of installing floodlights at the War Memorial is £ 2854.66 plus VAT, a total amount of £ 3354.23, of which the Branch would be required to contribute 25%. or £ 838.56. Not a modest amount, an amount, in fact which represents 30% of our current assets. The question is : do we wish to contribute to the installation of the floodlighting and if we do, is there any financial support available from, for example, the Highlands and Islands Area Council of the Legion. I expect the Area Council would require that we make an effort to raise some of the amount needed before becoming involved. In that case some sort of fund-raising exercise would have to be carried out by the Branch.

Your comments would be appreciated - as soon as possible please as the quoted cost is valid only until 1 September 1997.
