- L. Entries must not be grown at any stage in a Greenhouse.
- No name of Individual or Institute must be visible on any exhibit. Only those bearing sealed labels will be accepted.
- 6. Institute Secretaries should forward to the Federation Secretary, by 27th FEBRUARY, the number of entries in each section from their Institute. No entry will be accepted after that date.
- 7. Competitors must be responsible for the delivery and removal of their exhibits.
- 8. Numbers of prizes will be awarded according to the number of entries. Points to be awarded: 1st, 4 points; 2nd, 8 points; 3rd, 2 points; V.H.C., 1 points.
- 9. Attention is drawn to the conditions regarding the Henderson Challenge Cup.
- 10. All exhibits must be in Clashmore Hall by 10.30 a.m. on the day of the show, and no exhibit may be removed before the close of the show.
- 11. Entry Fee, 3d per entry.
- 12. The Judges' decisions are final.
