Allsorts After-School Club ran a successful summer playscheme in the West Church Hall. The project was supported by Highland 2007 as part of the Year of Highland Culture and the programme was based on Highland heritage, in partnership with Historylinks Museum.

Through dressing-up, storytelling, art workshops, acting, singing, dancing and visits to Historylinks the children

have explored their heritage. Two themes were chosen – the Vikings, and fishing and crofting. Costumes were made by Sheila Kennard and props including fishing baskets, shields and helmets were made by Sally Wild. Art workshops were run by Sally and Jane Bregazzi and a dance workshop by Sandra Robertson.

Storyteller Bob Pegg captured the children's imagination with his tales and music, enabling them to stage a small performance in costume at the end of the day. The children learned and performed a Gaelic song, Brochan Lom, and had a porridge tasting session.

The annual day trip was to Aigas Field Centre in Beauly for a special Highland 2007 day - finding out about birds, wild flowers beavers and but circles
