Re: UPGRADING AND EXTENSION TO DORNOCH SOCIAL CLUB - 056

Further to our meeting on 22 January 1981 in our office, at which both Mr. W. Ashplant and Mr. G. Bryce were present, I write to confirm the decisions taken.

After reading through the report supplied by A. Torrance & Associates, it was agreed that the list of contractors as prepared would be accepted, and negotiations would take place with J. & S. Gunn, Builders; I. Fearn, Plaster work and A. Macleod, Painter work. With regard to painting, it was agreed that the emulsion treatment to walls would be removed from the Bill at this time, and carried out voluntarily.

The other savings which were listed including the removal of the stone work chimney at the rear, construction of a ticket hatch, and the construction of the raised platform area with planting boxes in the Coffee Lounge were to be included in the total contract at this time.

The cost of the "AIRDUN" electric heating units was to be checked and the possible purchase of these now in order to save inflation cost was to be investigated. The storage of these units would then be organised by yourselves, and I would recommend that they could be stored in the Lesser Hall of the Community building, since it will be insured throughout the length of the contract for loss or damage. We are to check the cost of manufacturing the ducting and approach G.A. Mackenzie for a cost for this item.

With regard to the running of the building throughout the contract, we decided that the concrete floor in the entrance lobby should be laid as soon as possible, and thereafter the Main Hall closed for use by the public.

To this end, we shall discuss some works which can be carried out now by Mr. Gunn and remove these items from his Bill in order that we can calculate the amount of money which will have to be spent by the Community Association. We shall also complete a work programme for the complete contract, and discuss this with yourselves at our next meeting which is to be on Thursday 5th February 1981 at 8.00 p.m. in this office.



I look forward to completing all the outstanding cost elements in this exercise and indeed to getting the contract on site.

REGISTRATION OF SOCIETY


I wish to draw your attention to Schedule 1 and Paragraph 9 of the above named Act where it is stated that every Society which is registered under the Act shall pay to the Local Authority on the first day of January in each year, while it is so registered, the fee payable which is £5.00.

I have also to draw your attention to Schedule 1 and Paragraph 8 of the Act where it states that a Society which is for the time being registered under this Act may, at any time, apply to the Local Authority for the cancellation of the registration.

If you do not wish your Society to be registered during the year 1981 please let me know within 14 days.

I have also to refer to Schedule 1 (Part II) of the Act which requires the promoter of the lottery to submit, not later than the end of the third month in which the winners of prizes in the lottery are ascertained, a return certified by two members of the Society who have been appointed by the Society to certify that the return is correct. Please ensure that any return outstanding is now submitted to me.


Firstly, may I take this opportunity of wishing you and your Committee our best wishes for 1981. The indications from the contractors who are pricing the above project, are that we should be within our target, although there are many loose ends still to be tied up.

I am at present negotiating with Mr. A. Mackay of Proncy with regard to the excavation cost at the rear of the building, and to that end we are preparing detailed drawings at present for Mr. Mackay.

The contractors are all grateful for the extension of time to mid-day on Wednesday 14th January, and because of the nature of this contract, I would very much appreciate either yourself or your Chairman to be present in this office, when we open these priced Bills of Quantities. They are to be opened at mid-day on that date, and Mr. A. Torrance and myself will be here to discuss these costs.

As we have already decided, Northern Treatments are to carry out the infestation treatment of the existing building, and to that end, Mr. I. Fearn is ready to commence works on Monday or Tuesday of next week. He has discussed this with the caretaker and it appears that this will be a suitable time, but I am informing yourself so that the Committee will know that these works are being done.
