Norm gets on well with every one. I don't think he would change while he is away. The only thing he is getting much older from when he left us. I do hope Mrs Grant you have had news of your boys. You would wonder how the Germans can hold out so long. They seem to be giving them all they have. I had a cable last week from Norm for my birthday also telegrams from my other two sons. On Les sent through the florist the most beautiful box of flowers for my birthday. I thought it was a lovely thought of him. I suppose Mrs Grant you are sick of the winter well I hope by the time you get this the weather will be better. It must be very pretty over your way. I think Norm has been very lucky to have had the opportunity of seeing your country. We asked Norm what the baby was a boy or girl but we have not heard yet. These airmen are the best as we soon seem to get our answers back. We were pleased to get the Edinburgh News it had a good write up of the Squadron, Norm has a pretty flying time when they fly such long hours. We got two papers which Norm sent us he can't put much in letters so that

was a good² way to get it.
Norm was saying he might not be
home for another twelve months.
but dont suppose they know any
more than we do. The war needs
