Besides what's @ mentioned the Purf^r Mr Glass has
been put to very Considerable Charges & Expences on
acco^t of this Process, having been obliged to go to
Sutherland once and to Edin^r twice on that Acco^t
each of which Journeys from Aberdeen shire the place
of his residence must have cost him no less than
£ 10^r. besides loss of Time & Business, and being by
Trade a Mer^r had he got pay^r of his Money when due,
he certainly could have made at least double Int^r of it,
which would at this Time be about £ 5^r. more
than common Interest But these his Damages
he chuses to restrict altogether to the Sum of 10

The Soc Ordinary having considered thus accompt
Objections thereto & Answers to these Objections Repells the
Objections to the Articles from the first to the Tenth both
inclusive as also to the Articles 12. 13. 14. 33. 34 and 36
and sustains these Articles, Restricts Art: 11.th to £3
and with respect to the Articles from the 19th to the
32^o both inclusive and the Article 35. Finds
the Magistrates liable only in a fifth of these
Sustains the Objections to Articles 15. 16. 17. 18 & 38
and repells those Articles and as to Article 37.
Finds the Magistrates only liable in such part
of the Expenses of extracting the Decrees as shall
refer to what of said Decrees shall concern
the Magistrates as the same shall be ascertain-
ed by the Collector of the Clerks Dues his
Declaration.
