I am enclosing for you a copy of a letter which I have just sent to the Regional Planning Director, in Inverness. I am sorry that I have not met with you to discuss this, but I think you will be able to do something about the matter which will be of benefit. I have written to Col. Gilmour also. As you yourself no doubt also noticed at the Meeting, after 3 hours' of discussions on proposals and when Voting had begun on the issues already raised in them, a totally new main proposal was introduced which radically, in fact, changes the whole Square.

Should the visual and practical consequences of widening the pavement on the S. side not be explained to the Public now, they are going to be in for quite a nasty shock when they eventually find the Square has parked cars and buses almost down the middle of it, and that it is not the Square they wanted to keep.

I understand that I was not the only person to have been angry at the way this proposal was introduced, however the main thing is that Dornoch is made quite aware of what would be the result of agreeing to it in fact. Half of my family is Murray and I love the Square

as it is, but with the general recommendations
that you put forward I am in complete
agreement.
