elder brother Wm (5 Saib). granted to him 16 daresches of
land in the free barony of Torboll. to be held in the
barony for the service of one knight yearly.

marie - Mary. dau: of co heiress of Reginald de Cheyne.
by whom he acquired part of the ancient barony of
Duffus. & also - it would appear - lands in Culters
Isleue.

William above had a daughter Elizabeth who married the earl of Caithness (3rd earl.)

William Sutherland - son of William above -

of his father between 22 July 1527 & 1st April 1529.

on his father's death he purchased Skelbo for

2,300 marks - William was murdered at Thurso.
about 1530.

Sew. 102-3 Succeeded by son William, who tried to avenge his
father's murder - he also held Pormoy.

Torbay & other lands.

It was this William who was the father of ~~Alexander~~^{2nd}
~~Alexander~~. William of Saelix, who with his eldes brother
~~John~~ took part in the taking & keeping of Berrydale
Castle. also at the burning of Dornoch &
St. Gilbert's tomb.

Alexander's succ: his father William - he held
Skelbo, Inverness - Pormoy, Torbay, etc.

He also was in the band that attacked
Dornoch - in 1567 & 1570.

Succed by Alexander (II) ~~the~~ a minor - he belonged to
the E. of Caithness Dauphine Elizabeth - died young &
she married Hugh Mackay of Fars;

Alex. I had also. William & James born 1571.

James was the ancestor of the Sutherlands
of Reayshair.

Sutherland of Duffus - Reasonwell - Suelix

The descendants of William of Suelix were Farmers & a factor.
William the 2nd son of Alex¹ I succeeded to Duffus

about 1579 - he also held Pionsy - died 1616.

1. He was succeeded by his son William - → had a 2nd son - James of Kinrossie, who also held Blairich from John Murray of Abicross. James Sutherland was Tutor of Duffus to his nephew. James was still alive in 1679, but died before 1680.
2. & a 3rd son John Sutherland of Cleyne

James Sutherland of Kinrossie - had a son Alex² of Kinrossie. Alex² married Jean - daughter of Thomas Forbes of Waterston & their descendant was Mary Sutherland of Kinrossie - who married Alex³ Sutherland - of Cleyne - who was served heir to his grandfather John S. of Cleyne. Their son was James Murray Sutherland of Cleyne & Polrossie. Who was invested in 1756 as heir of his grand-father James Sutherland of Cleyne. See old map of Polrossie 1756.

John of Cleyne had John who was his heir Aug 1671. His sons were Patrick, James Patrick apparently died c. 1700 & James succeeded to Cleyne & Cleyne Kirkton - his sons were Alexander who succeeded his grandfather John of Cleyne & it was his Alex³ who married Mary Sutherland above

1609. "Harms of Assent against" "Harms of Tivinish & others
to the number of ten, all armed with swords, gaurlets
platesleeves, bows, clarlocks, dirks, targes & with
hagbuts & pisolets, came to the complainants
"gangand plenches" on his lands of Cessin - "kurst
ten soldiers of the score plough"; chased away
his oxen & assaulted his ploughmen.

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Doric McKergie of Cosach complains that on
May 19th last Donald Neilson of Cessin with
others to the number of 16 all armed with bows,
clarlocks dirks & targes came to the complainants
lands of dochanchas, demolished the shiel
thereon, hongned three score kye, cur (the tails
of horses) & violently assaulted the herd.
The defendant was denounced for non-appearance.



To Recuiting Duffus -

5745

Nicholas Saltisland - 2nd son of Kenneth 4th Earl
was the first of his sons of Tolboll & Duffus.
on the 13th Febr 1360 - he had a charter
from his brother the 5th Earl of Saltisland - in
this charter, widely scattered lands were
conventioned - such as Tolboll- Ricemarke
Croft- Oke- Prong, Neltie Prong, Prong Croz
Soelix- Gruny brog, Schibencroft, Kiphuddes
ture, & Beg, under the charter of Henry Ferry. -
Cayen lying on the East side of Strath Lethil
or Helmodale River - & one clavach of
Kiphuddes lying in the same direction.

He was granted these lands to be held by him
for the yearly service of one Knight or soldier
& he acquired even greater estates through
his marriage with Mary Cheyne, daug: of Sir
Reginald Cheyne. & his wife Mary de Moravia &
Duffus-

The Moravia of Duffus had possessed
over estates in Caithness & Strathmore -

& Cen heiress had married Freskin de Moravia - Chyn
had three daughters, who divided Cen estates - Cen
eldest Mary married Sir Reginald Cheyne, & had a
son & heir of Duffus. Cen barony of Straloch
& Chyn, Cen next had a part of Duffus & Straloch
etc. (Reynore, Arndale, Farn & Strathay) i Cen
grandson - Cen remaining part of Duffus, & other
lands including Sart, now Sarty b.

Nicholas Salteland acquired through Mary
Cheyne, Cen half of Duffus, Cen Straloch etc land
the family became possessors of Skelbo, about 1529
when it was bought from John Lyndard for a
sum of 2,300 marks. He also conveyed to them
Ahuscor, Innerstain & other lands - it was he
who gave Cen lord of Sorn - rent to Cen Earl of
Sutherland as his vassal. Cen penalty for which
was £15-00 £5-00 of which was to be paid to the
Cathedral of Dornoch £5-00 to Cen Master, £5-00
to Cen King. On purchase, William Salteland
was killed at Thrus by Cen Stan Gunn about
1530 & his brother Gordon "that Cen had ill
luck" dyed of Cattaynes was in a tumult

to revenge ~~this~~ himself for the murder of his father,
the young Laird seized one of the Bishop's Servants
& he & his Uncle the Dean of Culross were cited
before the Priory council. On appearing they
were thrown into ward - & were compelled to come
to terms before being set at liberty. His son
William - (of East) the Bishop of Moray granted
to the Salters (a class of Duffus, false marts of law
in Stratford-on-Avon) the sum yearly paid to
the Chaplains of St Michael.

This William Duffus had 3 (or 4) sons of
whom Alexander the eldest succeeded his
father & William the 2nd son is called by
Cecil in his part with his brothers in the
burning of Dunroick Cathedral, 1570. in the
taking & keeping of Berriedale Castle, & he is
said to have broken open the Coffin of
Bishophill Gilbert Murray & scalped his
bones. for which fact of desecration Sir
Robert Soden says he died soon after of a
loathsome disease

Alexander Duffus his elder brother, who succeeded his father 1543 was still a minor in 1554. On 7th Novth 1562. His lands of Princetown, & all his other territory in Sutherland were erected into a barony & the Earl of Sutherland. He allied himself with the Earl of Marquess of Huntly part in the attack on Dornoch in 1567 & also when the town & cathedral were laid waste in 1570. Sir Robert Sodm says he put to death the hostages surrendered by the Town of Dornoch - & fell ill & died soon after.
