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Hector Munro of Assent entered the army. m: Isabel

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Hector appears to have sold a "Bochered"
the Assent estate to his son-in-law Alex.
Mackenzie of Coull. He had however
purchased the lands of Inveran & of Achness
from John Gadow of Swab. Hector Munro
died at Inveran 4th June 1616.

1. Geo. Munro - 3rd son of
Sir George Munro of Newmore - from whom he
received the lands of Culrain & also Culcairn.
He lived in the house of ~~Culrain~~ Culcairn and a
farm. They seem to have come into possession
of Culrain in the early 18th century.
The estate fell into debt & Sir Hector Munro got
possession of it by way of payment for a
loan of £5000.
Culcairn was sold to Duke of Calrossie in 1878
for £16,500.

p. 84 Lord Keays sister, Mary, married Sir Hector Munro in 1619.

p. 84 Sir Hector was created a baronet of Nova Scotia by Charles I 1634. He was the 19th Baron 2nd Baronet of Foulis. He married Lord Keays sister Mary.

It is a mistake to think that the Munros of the time were men of mean birth many of them were broken nearly related to lords of good family. Such was the two: Hector Munro, brother of John, whose mother was sister to Lord Keays a daughter to Hugh Mackay &

1669 the man who joined Lord Heaps of Foulis -
but his elder brother John also served abroad
John was killed at Wetterau 1633. His son was
drowned at sea 1639. unmarried He was also John

1675 John Munro was succeeded by Robert 1669
who in the same year became Robert Munro of
Foulis - succeeded by his cousin Sir Hector.
He was great grandson of Robert Munro 15th Baron of
Foulis.

and built Tarbat House -

The family became extinct when
Andrew Munro VIII was killed at the
X of Kilsyth. 1645. but another
branch apparently inherited
Newmore - see Woodrow & the Gopriak
