The estate fell into debt & Sir Hector Munro got
possession of it by way of payment for a
loan of £5000.
Culcairn was sold to Rose of Calrossie in 1888
for £16,500.

of Fife to Hector Brum of Pittance


In this year Hector Brum of

1632 & two years later he sold ~~them~~
lands & bought Errilol ~~&~~ Hector married
Sarah Brewster daughter of Neil Brewster of
Cochrane. The lands of Achries were sold to
John Gordon of Smo — of Lord Grey's son
Henry had married Hector Brewster ~~to~~ or
Baron of Donlis in 1619. He was made
Nova Scotia Baronet by King Charles in 1634

I Andrew Murray: Was for a few years Tutor of Fowles
Andrew died before Dec⁶ 1607
apparently in possession of Linton
His widow m^t Gilbert Grey of Skelby
In the army became a colonel
Changed sides, was a Covenanter then
a Royalist then covenanted again.
When Montrose landed from Caithness
Col. Murray, Linton had 500 men under
him at Tain - later Saltoun & Balmedie
X of Culbokie's defeat of Montrose

Linton's sister married to Neil
Balfour of Auchleck-

Hilntown^d
Munro of Newmore Celtic Sag X.
He was a descendant of Cenred
Beg - the brat - who was in
command of Inverness Cstl
for possession of the castle in
the Chanony when they were
besieged for four years - see Gordon.

Hilntown was sold 1656
to Sir George Mackenzie of Tarbat
who pulled down the castle
& built Tarbat House -

The family became extinct when
Andrew Munro VIII was killed at the
battle of Killiecrankie 1689. but another
branch apparently inherited
Newmore - see Wedderburn Gopis 24

Celtic Bag Munro of Biltonrow

8 - 49 - 103 -

Family founded by John s. of Hugh Munro
12th of Fowlis about 1465 -

Fought & of Clashnacarry - (Fought in
the service of Bristow. Inver.)

Succeeded by Andrew II who began to
build the castle of Biltonrow - see Gordon
p 146 now New Tarbat or Tarbat
House.
