3/6 a Qtr: to posts for carrying the bag to W/helmsdale paid the Post Charged by Mr Taylor

What is the meaning of this is not the(a) (?) £5.. 4 in full to the posts

As to the letters you receive --ee-W/Helīxtkinkxxxxx should receive half of the allowances made by the Gentlemen for the W/Helmdale bag, as having half the trouble of it with the postmaster of Dornoch.

So the post was expected to ford the river at Helmsdale except when in flood ! He must have had soaking wet feet for the rest of his journey and in winter what of the icy cold of the water ? (K.J.L.)
