The Saltuaries of Duffus adhered to the covenant

& their lands were wasted by Bonfires

In 1647 the Estates taking into consideration the  
supplication of Saltuaries of Duffus & his uncle James  
Saltuare - for the damage they had sustained for  
their adherence to the covenant voted them an allowance  
of £2,000 Scots, (acts of Parl. vol 6 pt 1. 8100) but  
as the Estates failed in their promises of the money  
was never paid - Duffus went over to Holland &  
joined the Royal exile. He accompanied Charles  
when he returned to Scotland & landed at Kippside  
Jan 1650. As a reward Charles raised him to  
the Peerage 8<sup>th</sup> Dec 1650. He was Governor of  
Perth for Charles 1651. but he surrendered it to  
Cromwell.

Later however he lost favour owing to his  
connection with the Duke of Argyll, who was  
tried & imprisoned, sentenced to death but later  
released, in a letter he wrote (reflections on Lord  
Middleton) to Duffus

Ruffus. (Dunay Rue.)

The Ruffus had a charter of the lands of Ackergill  
31<sup>st</sup> Aug. 1674 (in the time of Alex<sup>?</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Lord D)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Ruffus was very extravagant & was  
obliged to dispose of his estates to his ~~brother~~ 2<sup>nd</sup> son  
James - so that when his eldest son Kenneth  
succeeded he was practically landless; James  
was obliged to sell the estates to Archibald  
Dunbar of Thunderton

5<sup>th</sup> Lord D. at the outbreak of the rebellion 1715 he joined  
his kinsman the Earl of Seaford at Tain  
where he took part in the rising the Earl of  
Sutherland as superior seized the Castle & Estates  
of Skelbo; Dunbar of Thunderton brought an  
action against him dispossessing the tenants etc.  
The case was carried to the H. C. & the Earl  
retained possession, & has done so ever since!

Kenneth died abroad about 1734 leaving  
Eric - = Elizabeth Dunbar & Hemphill  
Charlotte - = Gordon of Gruin -  
Anna = Gustavus Palbiski.

Eric was succeeded as titular Lord Ruffus - he  
was an ensign in Col: Disney's regiment in 1757  
He was succeeded by his only surviving son James

## Sutherland of Duffus.

Nicholas Sutherland - 2<sup>nd</sup> son of Kenneth - 4<sup>th</sup> Earl of Suth:  
received from his brother 5<sup>th</sup> Earl  
a charter for the lands of Tolboll.

13<sup>th</sup> Sept 1360. He married  
Mary daughter & co-heiress of Reswick  
le Cheyne and Mary Lady of Duffus  
with her he received his portion of the  
Lordship of Duffus & was styled  
Lord of the Castle of Duffus.

By act of Parliament he was restored to the Honourable & of Lord Duffus 1826  
died unm. 1827 age 80

VI Benjamin Dunbar, styling himself Lord Duffus cousin & h. male. being g<sup>t</sup> & only surviving s. of Rev Mr Dunbar of Hemps. wife. by his 2<sup>d</sup> w. Hamilton s. of Hugh Rose of Kilbravoch.

This man was descended of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Duffus.

Two years later Bothwell  
having seen his way to force Mary  
to Queen, was not sorry to let a  
little thing like a divorce stand  
in the way of his much worldly  
advancement. Jane Gordon  
brought a suit for divorce against  
him on ground of adultery with  
one of his servants. The decree  
commission for the divorce was  
issued on Sunday - the judge  
pronounced a verdict in favor of  
Lady Jane on Monday & two days  
later the marriage was annulled  
~~almost~~ <sup>so early</sup> a record for divorce proceedings.

a week after the decree was promulgated Mary & Bothwell were married at Holyrood.

Tam Fenton retired to his brother's house at ~~Strathlochie~~ Huntly - ~~Wick~~. Here also was another refugee - Alexander (in 17<sup>th</sup> Earl - some 30 or years younger than Tam) for he had been driven from his possessions by his guardian (in S. of Caithness). On attaining his majority he obtained possession of his estates & in 1543 he married the former Countess of Bothwell.
