Many thanks for your letter, undated and with no reference number received Nov 5th. I don't understand it very well and would like to consult my solicitor but as he is probably an agent for some other company I suppose he would want me to change over to his company.

With regard to the policy renewal paper sent with the letter I don't see any possibility of flood damage here. Storm damage might, I suppose include one of our hurricanes blowing off a chimney can, as it did to one of my neighbours the other day. I have no television and would not have one if you gave it to me and paid the licence!

This house has one room on the ground floor which is under my drawing room, but has its own entrance, back & front. This was formerly let to a tenant who never lived in it but used it to store boxes etc. This I never considered as coming under my insurance. It is now let to a girl who works in one of the County offices. The furniture is mine except for a few items which she has put in. How does this affect my insurance? The part of the house I use has four rooms furnished, plus kitchen, hall two partly furnished attics.
