SIR,

I am directed by the Secretary of State for War to inform you that you are declared to be one of the successful candidates at the recent examination of Militia Officers for commissions in the Army.

I am therefore to request that you will present yourself at 5, King Street, Westminster, S.W., at 10^{am} o'clock, on the 16th December, to undergo examination by a Medical Board as to your fitness for military service. A Declaration to be signed and handed to the Board is enclosed. The report of the Board will be considered final as determining your eligibility for a commission in the Army.

A memorandum on the subject of appointment to commissions is enclosed for your information, and you are requested to fill in the form annexed thereto and forward it to the "Military Secretary, War Office, Pall Mall, S.W.," as early as possible.

You are also requested to acknowledge the receipt of this communication *by return of post.*
