I am directed to inform you that a Pension of £ 100. a year  
has been awarded to you, as the widow of

£ 250. has also been awarded to you.

A compassionate allowance of £ 18 a year, from the same  
date, and a gratuity of £ 83.6-8 have also been granted to each of  
your two children who are under the prescribed ages.

These awards are at the rates fixed by the Royal Warrant for  
the family of a Captain killed in action.
