MADAM,

I am directed by the Paymaster General to acquaint you that your Pension has been revised by the Ministry of Pensions under the terms of the Royal Warrant dated 2nd July, 1920, and that authority has now been received to issue to you pension at the rate of £ 140 a year, together with Children's Allowances at the rate of £36 a year from the 1st April, 1920, in lieu of the pension and bonus and Children's Allowances hitherto payable.

I am to explain that the new rate includes an addition in consideration of the present increased cost of living. This addition will not be liable to withdrawal or reduction through a decrease of such cost before the 1st April, 1923. The bonus ceases to be payable from 1st April, 1920, as it is absorbed by this addition to the pension.

Any question as to the amount of the new award should be addressed to the Ministry of Pensions (Relatives Section), Officers' Branch, Baker Street, W. 1, and not to this Office.

A form is enclosed in payment of the arrears due to you from the 1st April, 1920, to the 30 - 6 - 20 . In future you should claim your pension as follows:—

At the end of the present month ... ... £

and thereafter,

At the end of the 1st month of each quarter ... £

Do. 2nd Do. ... £

Do. 3rd Do. ... £

(less Tax if liable).

At the end of each quarter, for a whole quarter... £ 35 (less Income Tax if liable).

The Children's Allowances have already been adjusted to the increased rate for the current year.
