Miss Chisholm is the only woman member of Dornoch Town Council—she is senior bailie—and at the wedding were several colleagues, the Rev. William MacLeod (provost), the Rev. F. H. MacLeod, Dornoch Cathedral (who performed the ceremony), and Mr W. C. Wright, town clerk. The Rev. A. Bailey, of St Mark's, was also present.

The bride, who was given away by her brother, Mr Ian R. W. Chisholm, wore a wine brocade suit and carried wine and white orchids. Her matron of honour was Mrs Margaret Fraser, who wore a navy blue dress and white hat to match, and carried a spray of white orchids. Best man was the groom's son, Gordon.

The ushers were Mr W. C. Wright and Mr G. M. Morrison, Bonar-Bridge, a member of Sutherland County Council. Miss E. Riley, Inverness, was organist.

The reception was held in the Islands Hotel Inverness.
