Branch Meeting Friday 30th October 1964

A. Branch meeting was held in the
Council Chambers Norwich on Friday 30th Oct 1964
at 7.30 P.M.

Mr John Lawse was in the chair.

Twenty one members were present.

The meeting opened with silent tribute to
fallen comrades, associating the names of Mr John
Maequqot & Mr Donnie Murray.

The minutes of the Annual General meeting
held on 19th February 1964 was read & approved.

Arising from the minutes the Secretary
reported to the meeting that the appeal to the
local churches on behalf of the Benevolent
Fund brought in a total sum of £28-16-8

Mr Lawse reported to the meeting that in view
of the difficulty in getting a suitable book for Gerty
Maequqot locally, he arranged with Donald Grant
to get one when sent and take it to him
in hospital.

The meeting proceeded to discuss arrangements for the Remembrance Day Service, it was agreed that it be on similar lines to the previous year. Major A. Shaw would be in charge of the Parades to the Memorial and to the Church.

The Secretary stated that he understood there would be a detachment of "C" Coy T.A. on Parade.

Mrs G. Munro was again asked to lay the Legion wreath. Mrs J. R. MacRae asked if the Town Council could be written to before next Tuesday and informed of the arrangements.

The Secretary was instructed accordingly and to inform all the other organisations, also to advertise the Parades in the Northern Times.

Mr Stich was again in charge of the sale of Poppies and stated that he had arrangements in hand except for one district in Bishopfield.

It was again agreed the Branch enter a team for the Legion S.B.R. competition, noting that in the last year's competition they ained the area final.

The 1965 Legion Calendar was on view and members asked to place orders with Mr A.G. Macdonald Treasurer.

The original mini book was almost completed and a new one was to be produced.

This was all the business, and the Chairman then proceeded to introduce Mr. Col. Angus Macdonald, Strathpeffer, stating that Col. Macdonald was Vice Chairman of the Highland Area Council & who had very kindly travelled up from Strathpeffer that night, to present the Life Membership Certificates to the Rev Wm Macleod and Major Brauner.

Col Macdonald addressed the meeting referring to the many aspects and activities of the Legion in general and in particular to the Beveridge Fund and Persons. Before presenting the Certificates, he referred to the services rendered by the Doonoch Branch by the Rev Wm Macleod & Major Brauner also to their many activities as citizens of Doonoch and Sutherland.

Both Mr Macleod & Major Brauner replied and thanked Col Macdonald stating that they hoped to be able to continue to be of service to the Legion.

Mr Steel moved a vote of thanks to Col Macdonald, and Rev Wm Macleod to Mr Gause the Chairman.

Col Macdonald was afterwards entertained to tea in the Eagle Hotel.
