**DORNOCH LIGHT RAILWAY COMPANY - A**  
Dornoch on Wednesday last, the ordinary general meeting of the Company was held in the Council Chamber. In the absence of His Grace the Duke of Sutherland, Mr Donald Maclean Rhives, acted as depute-chairman.

The Directors' Report was unanimously approved of by the shareholders, as also the statement of accounts for the year ending 31st August, 1908.

The statement, though on the whole satisfactory, with a favourable increase in mineral shows a decrease in the number of passengers. The earnings of the line amount to £1646 4s 10d as against £1694 4s last year.

It was resolved to again urge the Highland Railway Company the expediency of increasing the fare from Dornoch to the Mound to 8d. It was also agreed to ask that the train on Friday nights should stop for passengers at Cambusavon if required, and that the first morning train on Saturdays should be discontinued during winter and summer. The 8.45am train is to be run on Saturdays.

His Grace the Duke of Sutherland was re-elected chairman, and Mr D Maclean depute chairman for the ensuing year; while Messrs W S Fraser and R F Cameron, CA, Inverness, were re-elected director and auditor respectively.
