Dornoch Foreshore.

The Board of Trade Official Papers, embracing the Board's correspondence with you, have been sent us, with instructions to communicate with you with the view of obtaining proofs of possession by the Burgh of Dornoch of the foreshore claimed on its behalf by the Town Council. In your letter of 2nd instant to the Assistant Secretary of the Board of Trade you say that the Council and Community have had immemorial possession. We should be obliged if you will produce such proofs to us.

In your letter of 9th March last to the Assistant Secretary you say that the Royal Burgh extends to the municipal boundary shewn on the Ordnance Survey Sheet. We beg to send you six inch Ordnance Survey Sheet herewith, which kindly return, and at same time inform us whether the letters A and B on that plan correctly mark the ends of the boundaries of the Royal Burgh, and whether the foreshore between the two boundary lines marked A and B is what is claimed /

claimed by the Burgh. Kindly also let us know whether the whole lands above and adjoining high water mark between the two lines A and B belong to the Burgh.
