I am also to state that the acts of possession by the Council over the toreshore in question detailed in the documents furnished by you in support of the claim do not appear to the Board to be of the exclusive character which have been held necessary in previous cases to prove a title by prescription.

The Board have therefore caused local inquiries to be instituted by the local Coast Guard officer who has reported that the inhabitants and public generally have at
