(b) With reference to your letter of the 17th instant regarding the application for the limitation of the speed of motor cars to ten miles per hour on certain thorough-fares in the Burgh of Dornoch, I am directed to request that you will take steps with a view to publishing the application by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Burgh, in order that the Secretary for Scotland may be enabled to judge of the necessity or otherwise of ordering a local inquiry. The advertisement should include an intimation that the detailed application may be inspected at the Office of the Town Clerk and that the Secretary for Scotland will be prepared to consider any objections that may be sent to him in writing addressed to the Scottish Office, Whitehall, within fourteen days from the date of the advertisement.

(c) The places where restriction is proposed should also be indicated on a map of sufficient scale, to be kept for the inspection of any person interested at the Office of the Town Clerk.


