

one of the pillars of the Fountain as shewn in red ink.

Dear Sir,

I have your letter of 3^r inst and I hereby offer to supply and fit up two Petrol Lamps on present Street Lamp Pillars as follows:- The present pillars to be placed on Cast Iron Boxes 2' 8" high by 30" octagonal and securely bolted to the boxes and the boxes bolted down to foundation stone. Assuming that your present Lamp posts are 9' 6" high this would give a height of 11' 8" to the arms. The present Lamps to be taken off. An iron tube about 3' 6" high with circled top fitted on to carry the lamp with a 2" projection from centre of tube to centre of lamp. The Petrol tank will be placed in the Box at foot of Post secured under lock.

The Petrol Tube to supply the lamp to be carried up inside the pillar. The total height of the lamp from ground to bottom of lamp will be about 13'. The whole fitted up complete for the sum of Nine pounds ten shillings each.

I do not approve of fitting the tanks under ground in manholes with metal covers. Your present Lamp posts are too low to obtain the full benefit of this powerful light and the proposal I submit should prove

satisfactory.

I enclose a sketch of what I would suggest. Please be good enough to return it not later than Wednesday as I require it for another town who are considering the matter.
