INSTRUCTIONS AND FORM OF AFFIDAVIT

FOR THE OUT-PENSIONERS OF CHELSEA HOSPITAL.

All Out-Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital who live beyond the District of the London Bills of Mortality, are hereby required and commanded, on, or immediately after every 25th of June, 25th of September, 25th of December, and 25th of March, to apply to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the neighbourhood where they reside, and make the following Affidavit, which the said Magistrate for the County, City, Borough, or Riding before whom the Pensioner appears, will sign and date, viz.

Geo. Grant came before me, one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of *Hoot* and made oath that he was admitted an Out-Pensioner of *Chelsea Hospital* on the *21st* Day of *June 1816* from the *93* Regiment of *Foot* commanded by *Gen. Murray* was then aged about *33* Years; served in the Army *14 1/2* Years, as per following Statement; was discharged for *an Amputated Arm* and that he is no otherwise provided for by the Public, but as a Pensioner of the said Hospital at *1/3* per Day, (except his Pay as *in the* Regiment of Militia,) and now lives in the Parish of *in or near the Market Town* of *in the County of*

And such of them as were admitted on account of Blindness are ordered to transmit, with their Quarterly Affidavits, a Certificate as to the state of their Sight, signed by an Army Surgeon, or other Medical Person, resident in their neighbourhood, but in such distant parts where a medical Certificate is impracticable, a Certificate from the Minister of the Parish to that fact, and to ascertain the continuance of their Blindness will be admitted.

The Affidavit drawn according to the above Form, sworn before, dated and attested by a Magistrate, is to be put up in a Cover, and sent, by the Post (directed thus) "To the Right Honourable the Pay-Master General of His Majesty's Land Forces, London," marking in the Corner of the Cover, "Chelsea Pensioner's Affidavit;" and Counterparts or Duplicates of the said Affidavit are to be reserved by the Out-Pensioners respectively, to be exhibited to such Persons as shall be directed to pay them, together with their Instructions and Certificates of Admission, in order that their claim to the Out-Pensions may be fully verified, and their Persons clearly identified,

The Pensioners are particularly to take Notice that the several subsequent Quarterly Payments are to be regulated hereafter as to the place of Payment, by the Musters of Chelsea, or by the Affidavits of those Pensioners resident beyond the Bills of Mortality sent as above, on or immediately after the preceeding Quarter Days beforementioned, without which their Names will not be entered on the Pay Lists.

And if any Pensioner shall fraudulently attempt to receive a double payment of his Pension, either at Chelsea, or at different places, he shall be struck off the List, and forfeit all Benefit arising from this Establishment.

N.B. The Pensioner is desired in all applications relative to his Pension, to mention the Regiment from which he passed the Board, as also his Rate of Pension, and his affidavit sent as above directed (to the Paymaster-General) to be endorsed thus,
