SIR,

Increased Food Production—Programme for 1919.

I am directed by the Board of Agriculture for Scotland to enclose herewith a Schedule relative to the proposals for next season's cultivation on your holding, and to request that you will kindly fill in the necessary particulars and return the form in accordance with the directions contained on the printed slip attached. In cases where farmers fail to return the form as directed, the Board may find it necessary to issue an Order under Defence of the Realm Regulation 2 M. (1) (O).

The Board desire me to impress upon you the fact that the necessity for the production of home-grown food now and in the future is as great as formerly. The Board are keenly appreciative of the manner in which farmers have responded to the appeals of the Government for increased cultivation, and they earnestly trust that in the national interest you will not relax your efforts in doing your utmost to cultivate your holding to the best advantage in the ensuing season. They also ask that your area under white crop and potatoes will not be less than in 1918, and, if possible, that that acreage will be exceeded. They accordingly request your cordial support for the efforts of the District Agricultural Executive Committee towards increasing the food supplies of the nation.
