Gentlemen,

We beg to suggest for your consideration the question of having application made to limit within the Municipal Burgh the speed of motor cars to ten miles per hour. Pedestrians at present have not only to suffer from the dust, which rises from a car driven through the Burgh at a high rate of speed, but, there is discomfort in dwelling houses and business premises from the same cause and there is considerable danger to children and elderly people crossing the roads.

It seems to be somewhat of an anomaly that in Villages within a short distance of Dornoch the speed limit is reduced to 10 miles per hour, while in the Capital and Chief Town of the County no such regulation exists.

We trust that in the public interests the matter will receive your favourable consideration and that the necessary order will be obtained.
